DEFINITIONS

<p><i>Refuse</i> means any solid waste or trash not included in the list under the term "Recyclables" that is allowed to be disposed of in a sanitary landfill. Refuse items are to be bagged and placed in the gray cart</p> <p>There are two types of Refuse in reference to Collection: <i>Domestic Waste</i> and <i>Structural Waste</i>, like a chair. <i>Domestic waste</i> means solid waste material resulting from the usual routine of residential housekeeping. <i>Structural Waste</i> is something like a chair or piece of furniture</p>	<p><i>Recyclables</i> means those items listed by the Village to be placed in the blue recycling cart and taken to a recycling facility to be converted into usable material</p>	<p><i>Brush</i> is defined as any woody material over 1/4" but less than 6" diameter that comes from a tree, bush or plant, including, but not limited to, tree branches, small trees, prunings and trimmings. Does not include stumps, roots or rootballs</p>	<p><i>Yard Waste</i> means all lawn and garden waste (including garden plants and thatch), but not including grass clippings, leaves, brush, stumps, roots, rootballs, soil/sand, rocks, concrete, brick, or other construction waste</p>	<p><i>Cart</i> means containers provided or sold by the Village for the collection of refuse or recycling</p>	<p><i>Grass Clippings</i></p> <p><i>Hazardous Substances</i> (see p. 8)</p> <p><i>Household Sharps</i> and medical sharp waste: sharps and any type of product capable of puncturing the skin</p>
